Brian Crichton

President of Talladega Superspeedway.

As vice president of marketing and sales at Talladega, Crichton oversees consumer marketing, public relations, ticketing, partnership marketing and sales. Crichton and his Talladega staff created the popular Friday Night "Big One on the Blvd." fan event and elevated the track's traditional Saturday Night Infield Concert. He has overseen the development of successful programs for military, first responders, teachers and educators, kids, scouts and college students. He has also been a major contributor in the planning efforts of Transformation. In his new role, Crichton will report to Joie Chitwood, COO, ISC and oversee promotion and operation of the 2.66-mile Talladega Superspeedway, which is celebrating its 50th Anniversary this year.

"Brian has earned this promotion following nearly 10 years of valued leadership at Talladega," stated Chitwood. "His creative marketing efforts, community building and fan-first mentality have helped Talladega Superspeedway become the most fan-friendly track on NASCAR's schedule."

With nearly 20 years of motorsports industry experience, Crichton served in successful capacities at Daytona International Speedway, Chicagoland Speedway and Route 66 Raceway. As vice president of special events and entertainment at Daytona International Speedway, he managed the 50th running of the DAYTONA 500 and grew marquee events including the Rolex 24 at Daytona, Bike Week and Biketoberfest.

"Brian is a strong promoter and Talladega's future is very bright with him at the wheel," said Lynch, who has been a staple at the track since 1993. "He has earned the trust and commitment of this team as they take 'Dega's storied legacy to new heights driving increased economic impact for the local community and the great state of Alabama."

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER



LtCol Donald (Don) D. Lehman, USMCR (Ret)

Don Lehman graduated from the University of Iowa and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Marine Corps in 1969. He served three years on active duty, including a tour in Vietnam with the First Marine Division and an additional 20 years in the Marine Corp reserves, retiring in 1992.

Don's civilian career as a petroleum geologist, spanned forty plus years working for multi-national oil companies as well as smaller entities, with final retirement from Energen Resources in Birmingham. Don now spends much of his time helping veterans less fortunate than himself.

As the 2nd VP/Membership Chair for the Greater Birmingham Chapter (MOAA), Don instituted an aggressive recruiting and retention program resulting in the Chapter being recognized as one of the top recruiting Chapters among the 400 MOAA Chapters nationwide. He developed a Facebook page, Chapter website, and heads our recruiting and information efforts at all community activities to inform and attract veterans to MOAA.

Don is a lifetime member of the Military Officers Association of America, the Marine Corps League, Krulak Marine Alliance, Vietnam Veterans and Disabled Veterans Associations, as well as a VA hospital volunteer, Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing and American Legion member. TRICARE Pharmacy Fees Set to Increase in 2020 (By: Kathy Beasley)

MOAA makes it a priority to prepare our membership well ahead of changes that will impact their earned benefits. In that regard, please consider this an advance notice for your planning purposes.

The cost shares for your medications, if you do not receive them at a DoD military treatment facility, will increase on Jan. 1.

Recall back in the 2017 NDAA, TRICARE's pharmacy cost shares changed across all medication tiers, and a new fee table was introduced. Beneficiaries saw their prescription fees start to rise in 2018 and 2019. As we published at the time, these fees will accumulate and continue to rise annually until 2027. According to a large percentage of respondents who have taken MOAA's health care surveys, many still recall the "sticker shock" they experienced when their mail order generic medication went from \$0 to \$7 – it was not so bad if you only had to take one, but most people take several so it added up very quickly.

These annual average increases continue to be substantial, especially if CPI remains tame and retired pay and social security incomes stay flat.

The bottom line is, TRICARE pharmacy fees and other provider visit cost-shares and premiums for both TRICARE Prime and TRICARE Select, are starting to squeeze beneficiaries. MOAA continues to press the DoD to show the results of how much revenue is being generated from beneficiaries and where it is being directed. We maintain any savings should be re-invested into the TRICARE health program, not diverted into other un-specified accounts.

<u>Summer Storm Recap: MOAA Members Send 15,500 Messages to Congress</u>

MOAA Members, and those you recruited to help, made a measurable difference in our advocacy efforts during our Summer Storm. We know the value of grassroots efforts, and regularly discuss the significance of such during our regional training sessions and chapter visits.

This more recent series of engagements started with a call to action from MOAA President and CEO Lt. Gen. Dana Atkins on July 29.

In true *Never Stop Serving* fashion, many of you took the field, made some outs and hit some home runs. Here are some of the stats:

- You sent 6,360 messages to Congress on the widow's tax.
 - o Current co-sponsorships: 377 in the House and 76 in the Senate
 - Senator Jones's Motion to Instruct the Senate Conferees was voted on by the Senate
 94-0; while not a binding vote it does indicate a continuation of support.
- You sent 9,122 messages to Congress on the military medical billet reductions.
 - This too has gotten support from both the House and the Senate during your engagements, our visits on the Hill, and repeated discussions with their staffs.

Both provisions highlighted in our Summer Storm are now in conference where the House and Senate will determine the final defense bill. We have come a long way to get to this point but there are no guarantees as to the ultimate outcome – we cannot slow down.

Congress is currently on their district and state breaks through Oct. 14 – this is another opportunity to contact them at home if you can. We need everyone to keep the pressure on congress, thank them for their support, and encourage them to pass the defense bill supportive of these and other priorities.

Veterans' Day is November 11th. It is also called Remembrance Day in Canada. I have a note that I often share with veterans who never saw combat, or who are somewhat embarrassed that they served only a year or two. This is what is says: "What is a Veteran? A "Veteran"-whether active duty, discharged, retired, or reserve, is someone who, at one point in his life, wrote a blank check made payable to "The United States of America", for an amount of "up to, and including his or her life." That is honor. And there are way too many people in this country today who no longer understand this fact."


