MARCH SPEAKER

Niki Sepsas

Niki Sepsas, a renowned speaker, historian, tour guide and author, will be our speaker for the March meeting. He spoke to us several years ago on the topic of **The Normandy Invasion**: **What if . . . ?????**, which was very interesting and thought provoking. His topic at our March meeting will be:

<u>Valor in the Ardennes: The Battle of the Bulge.</u> More than 600,000 men would participate in the largest and bloodiest battle of World War II during Christmas 1944 when Adolf Hitler's last great counteroffensive would result in the epic clash in the Ardennes Forest of Belgium and Luxembourg.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

More than a season, most often the word spring is mentioned as a source of water; someplace calming; a place of refreshment, or sustenance. The promised land was "...a wonderful land, a land with streams of water, springs, and wells that gush up on the hills... (Deut 8: 7). In the Psalms, spring is both water and growth...God's salvation is very close to those who honor him so that his glory can live in our land. Faithful love and truth have met; righteousness and peace have kissed. Truth springs up from the ground; righteousness gazes down from heaven. (Psalm 85:99-11. Again, in Isaiah, ...you will draw water with joy from springs of salvation. (Isaiah 12:3).

I think most Christians are familiar with the story in the book of John about Jesus meeting the Samaritan women at the well. Jesus said to the woman …" If you recognized God's gift and who is saying to you, 'Give me some water to drink,' you would be asking him and he would give you living water." (John 4: 10). Jesus further tells the woman, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks from the water that I will give will never be thirsty again. The water that I give will become in those who drink it a spring of water that bubbles up into eternal life."

This March, let's see how God is once again making things new, and celebrate, as the Lord says in Revelation 21: 6..."to the thirsty I will freely give water from the life-giving spring."

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

March is the start of an exciting political year. The Primary Elections are on March 3rd and the General Elections will be held on November 3rd. Alabama citizens will have the opportunity to vote for the President/Vice President, one U.S. Senate seat, 7 seats in the U.S. House of Representatives and various State and County offices. In our Districts (6&7), we will vote for President/Vice President, a seat in the U.S Senate, 2 seats in the House of Representatives, and various Local and County officials.

The Alabama Secretary of State publishes a Voter's Guide which contains information on which Offices are included in the election year, election dates, crossover voting rules for the primary and general elections, voter registration deadlines, voter eligibility, and many other topics which will help navigate the voter system. The Voters Guide can be accessed online at: <u>www.sos.alabama.gov</u>.

Even though we are focused on the national elections this year, we still need to stay focused on MOAA issues and make our elected officials' aware what legislation is important to serving and retired servicemembers. Below is an article I borrowed from the Take Action section of the MOAA website (<u>www.moaa.org</u>) which is applicable for both serving legislators and those running for elected offices.

MOAA's 6 Tips for Engaging Congress

1. Identify your congressional representatives. A quick Google search can usually tell you who represents your congressional district, but if you aren't sure, reach out to MOAA staff directly. And if you're an active duty servicemember or spouse living outside the district you vote in, make sure to engage with your representatives at your home and in the district where you currently live.

2. Choose a specific issue. Identifying a targeted topic and outcome can help focus the conversation with your representative. It's even better if you can share your personal connection to the issue.

3. Call your representative's offices directly. MOAA provides a direct number to the Capitol Switchboard, which will connect you directly to the office of your members of Congress.

4. Use the MOAA Take Action Center. MOAA provides email and letter templates for engaging on timely issues of importance to our members, as well as a system to submit them directly to your representatives. Visit takeaction.moaa.org.

5. Start a social media campaign. Engage with your representatives on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, and other social media platforms, and encourage your friends and family members to do the same. The greater the number of comments on an issue, the more likely it is to grab the attention of a congressional office and encourage staffers to respond.

6. Show up. If your representatives are at home in your district, attend their town halls and other public events, and make sure to do your homework. Also, even if you can't attend the annual Storming the Hill event in March, be sure to participate from home by calling, emailing, and posting on social media using #MOAA Storms.

Jobs and Childcare for Military Families Act of 2020

Rep. Donald Norcross (D-N.J.) introduced H.R. 5876, the Jobs and Childcare for Military Families Act of 2020, on Feb. 12 as a companion bill to the Senate version introduced by Sen. Tim Kaine (D-Va.) last summer. MOAA supports the legislation, which would include military spouses as a target group for the Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC) and provide Flexible Spending Accounts (FSA) as an employee benefit for servicemembers.

"The Work Opportunity Tax Credit has been instrumental in reducing veteran unemployment rates and could be a vital solution to addressing the high military spouse unemployment rate." said Lt. Gen. Dana T. Atkins, USAF (Ret), MOAA's president and CEO. "Additionally, every federal agency offers flexible spending accounts as an employee benefit. With the rising cost of health care and child care, now is the time to extend that benefit to service members to give them an option to mitigate these financial burdens.

"MOAA fully supports this legislation and we urge members of Congress to sign on in support of this legislation — our military families deserve no less."
