

Thompson: Country Club of Birmingham's Gene Cushman - at 89 - knows golf is a game you can play for life

Any golfer would be delighted to shoot 72 on the West Course at the Country Club of Birmingham. Gene Cushman shot such a round late last month. Why is this notable? He turns 90 next month.

Cushman, described as "ageless" by CC of Birmingham director of golf Eric Eshleman, has shot lower before, but the spread of score versus age is the largest for him. Seventeen strokes under his age is amazing. His previous best was 15 strokes, shooting 71 when he was 86.

He first matched his age when he shot 67 and has repeated or bettered the feat hundreds of times.

In robust health, he is justifiably proud of his golfing exploits, but he is not one to toot his own horn. A golfing partner and friend, Ivey Jackson, let me know about Cushman.

Cushman said he really did not start taking much notice of the times he would better his age until he turned 80.

"Someone said it would be a good idea to keep up with it."

Here is the math. In the decade about to conclude when he turns 90 in September, he has averaged playing two rounds a week (one each on the East and West courses) for 40 weeks a year. That equals 800 rounds played, give, or take a few. He will also mix in a round here and there at Willow Point, where he has a second home. How many times in all those rounds of golf has he failed to beat or match his age? One time is all.

Alabama Sports Hall of Fame inductee Elbert Jemison, a noted amateur golfer in his day and also a longtime member at Birmingham, will turn the same age as Cushing this year. "Gene is one of the good guys. He's been a fine player for many, many years," Jemison said.

Cushman grew up on various Army posts and served in the Air Force for 27 years before moving to Birmingham in 1968 to marry his wife, Eleanor. He worked the next 30 years in the insurance business until he retired at age 80.

"My father told my brother and I that we had to learn two sports, golf and tennis, growing up because you can play them your whole life. I'm so glad he insisted on such."

No doubt Cushman took that to heart as he loves playing golf and he comes from good genes. Both his mother and his mother's mother lived to be 97.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

What Does the Continuing Resolution Mean, and What Happens Next (Brenden McMahon, MOAA Staff)

As of Oct. 1, Congress has again missed its deadline to pass necessary appropriation bills to fund the federal government for the new fiscal year. Instead, a continuing resolution (CR) will provide stopgap funding for government activities through Dec. 11. The House had no problem passing the measure with a 359-57 vote on Sept. 22; the Senate followed suit the evening of Sept. 30 with an 84-10 vote. The president then signed the CR into law.

So what does this CR, H.R. 8337, do?

It will fund programs and activities at FY 2020 levels, and it will extend several authorities and programs, including:

- Medicare Part B premium adjustments, and other Medicare and Medicaid-related authorities and programs.
- Authorities related to veterans' benefits.
- Nutrition programs for children, to include some eligibility waivers and modifications related to school and childcare closures.
- Authorities related to immigration.

MOAA appreciates elected officials securing short-term funding to avoid a costly government shutdown, but we urge Congress to get back to regular order and ensure predictable and timely funding of our government activities – and stop the habitual use of CRs in lieu of a full federal budget.

Those in uniform and their families count on their government to support them as they serve. They need Congress to push forward on passing a National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), backed up by full appropriations, so they can do their job without delays.

Senators Push to Extend Care to 34,000 More Veterans for Agent Orange Diseases

Senators have ramped up efforts to add three new diseases to the Department of Veterans Affairs' list of Agent Orange-related diseases, pressing the House and Senate Armed Services Committees to include them in the final version of the national defense policy bill.

Sen. Jon Tester, D-Mont., and 45 other senators sent letters Tuesday to leaders of the committees, imploring them to amend the fiscal 2021 National Defense Authorization Act to add bladder cancer, hypothyroidism and Parkinsonism to the VA's list of conditions linked to herbicide exposure in Vietnam and elsewhere.

The National Academies of Sciences, Engineering and Medicine in 2016 deemed the three illnesses to be associated with exposure to defoliants used during the war.

But VA officials have not added them to the list, saying they are waiting for the results of two studies -- the Vietnam Era Health Retrospective Observational Study, or VE-HEROeS, and the Vietnam Era Mortality Study -- to be reviewed for publication before announcing a decision on whether to broaden the presumptive list.



Preparing for the Unpredictable By: Gail Joyce

Many women — and men — are blindsided by the death of a spouse, because couples rarely talk about the inevitable.

When you are at your most vulnerable, you must make choices that will have an enduring impact. Should the body be cremated or preserved? What type of service and where will it be held? Will he or she be buried in a hometown family plot or in a national cemetery many miles away?

To be better prepared for these difficult decisions, take time to have that important conversation with your spouse and your children about death and what happens after death. This conversation is a gift of love that each member of a marriage or family makes to the other.

Resources are available on MOAA.org and other websites that will help you have those conversations and make planning for the unknown perhaps a little easier. Find out who your local veteran service officer is, get to know them before you really need them, and then make sure they are the first on your list to contact.

Steps to take:

- Encourage members and spouses to talk to each other about end-of-life issues and ways to prepare.
- · Prepare and organize important documents (such as DD Form 214, wills, living will, durable power of attorney, insurance policies, birth/marriage certificates, passwords, bank account and investment information).
- · Make sure utilities are in both names.
- Open a credit card account in *your name*.
- Establish eligibility for burial in a VA National Cemetery.
- Make a list of helpful resources, including MOAA, the
 VA, AARP.org, Military
 OneSource, MOAA Minnesota Chapter "The Day After
 Calls," MOAA's Surviving Spouse Virtual Chapter, and MOAA's Surviving
 Spouses and Friends Facebook group.




