History of Christmas in the Military

Christmas has long been celebrated in the military, even in times of war. Perhaps the most famous celebration of Christmas in the military is the Christmas Truce of 1914. Starting on Christmas Eve, troops on both the British and German sides began singing Christmas Carols to one another. The sounds of guns and cannons faded along the Western Front in Belgium and were replaced by holiday celebrations, albeit cautious ones, in the trenches. The Germans initiated this temporary "truce" and began with the singing of carols and placement of Christmas trees along the trenches. On Christmas morning, German soldiers emerged unarmed, calling out "Merry Christmas" to the Allied British soldiers in the trenches across no-man's-land.

This gesture of goodwill between enemies came a mere five months after the outbreak of war in Europe and is perhaps the last example of the concept of chivalry between enemies in warfare. This notion of goodwill between enemies was never again repeated, as future similar attempts were promptly squashed with threats of discipline from squad leaders. Even a world war could not destroy the Christmas spirit.

What Does the Continuing Resolution Mean, and What Happens Next (Brenden McMahon, MOAA Staff)

As of Oct. 1, Congress has again missed its deadline to pass necessary appropriation bills to fund the federal government for the new fiscal year. Instead, a continuing resolution (CR) will provide stopgap funding for government activities through Dec. 11. The House had no problem passing the measure with a 359-57 vote on Sept. 22; the Senate followed suit the evening of Sept. 30 with an 84-10 vote. The president then signed the CR into law.

So what does this CR, H.R. 8337, do?

It will fund programs and activities at FY 2020 levels, and it will extend several authorities and programs, including:

- Medicare Part B premium adjustments, and other Medicare and Medicaid-related authorities and programs.
- Authorities related to veterans' benefits.
- Nutrition programs for children, to include some eligibility waivers and modifications related to school and childcare closures.
- Authorities related to immigration.

MOAA appreciates elected officials securing short-term funding to avoid a costly government shutdown, but we urge Congress to get back to regular order and ensure predictable and timely funding of our government activities – and stop the habitual use of CRs in lieu of a full federal budget.

Those in uniform and their families count on their government to support them as they serve. They need Congress to push forward on passing a National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), backed up by full appropriations, so they can do their job without delays.

Medicare Part B Rates Will Rise in 2021

Your Medicare Part B bill will go up about 2.7% in 2021, with the rate of increase varying slightly depending on your income level.

Most Part B users will pay \$148.50 a month next year, up from \$144.60 in 2020. This is the standard premium, paid by those whose tax returns in 2019 were \$88,000 or less for an individual tax return (or married but filing a separate return) or \$176,000 for a joint return. Last year's base figures were \$87,000 individual/\$174,000 joint return.

Those who earned more pay an adjusted rate for Part B coverage by adding an Income Related Monthly Adjustment Amount (IRMAA) to the standard premium. The breakdown of those rates, per Medicare.gov is (Note: as with the standard premium levels, these income levels have risen slightly since 2020):

- Those with income from \$88,001 to \$111,000 on an individual return or from \$176,001 to \$222,000 on a joint return will pay **\$207.90 per month**, up from \$202.40 in this bracket in 2020.
- Those with income from \$111,001 to \$138,000 on an individual return or from \$222,001 to \$276,000 on a joint return will pay **\$297.00 per month**, up from \$289.20 in this bracket in 2020.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE (continued)

- Those with income from \$138,001 to \$165,000 on an individual return or from \$276,001 to \$330,000 on a joint return will pay **\$386.10 per month**, up from \$376.00 in this bracket in 2020.
- Those with income from \$165,001 to \$500,000 on an individual return, or \$88,001 to \$412,000 when married but filing a separate tax return, or from \$330,001 to \$750,000 on a joint return will pay **\$475.20 per month**, up from \$462.70 in this bracket in 2020.
- Those with income above \$500,000 on an individual return, or above \$412,000 when married but filing a separate tax return, or above \$750,000 on a joint return will pay **\$504.90 per month**, up from \$491.60 in this bracket in 2020.

As a note: The COLA for 2021 increased Social Security and Military Retirement Pay by 1.3%.

HOW SURVIVING SPOUSES BENEFIT FROM MOAA MEMBERSHIP

MOAA's mission is to improve the lives of those who serve and their families. As a MOAA member, surviving spouses have opportunities to connect with kindred surviving spouses in addition to receive information about benefits and programs that might be new to them.

Understandably, when someone becomes a surviving spouse, there is a certain knowledge gap to navigate. Surviving spouses of MOAA work to help close that gap.

It's also important to note many survivors might not be aware they are eligible to join MOAA even if their military spouses were not MOAA members.

Depending on your membership level, surviving spouses will have a consistent line of communication as well as support regarding their eligibility for various MOAA benefits, such as discounts, advocacy, scholarships, and membership to their virtual chapter. Communication options include telephone, emails, literature, social media, and webinars.




