LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

National Defense Authorization Act

The Senate passed a \$741 billion defense authorization bill December 11th with a veto-proof majority and sent the bill to the President for signature. However, a veto by the President would force a re-vote and could jeopardize some issues that MOAA supports.

Some of the approved NDDA provisions are:

Pay Raises – **Active duty** 3% military pay raise, effective Jan. 1, 2021 and general pay increase for Hazardous Duty Incentive Pay from \$250 to \$275 month.

Medical Billet Cuts and MTF Restructuring - One provision (Section 717) addresses medical billet cuts by prohibiting DoD and the services from reducing medical end strength authorizations for 180 days following enactment of the bill. It also requires DoD to conduct a review of medical manpower requirements that specifically considers the homeland defense mission and DoD's role in a pandemic influenza response, in addition to all other national defense strategy scenarios.

The other provision (Section 718) increases requirements for implementation plans for each MTF slated for restructure or realignment. It also requires DoD to certify to the congressional defense committees that a covered beneficiary affected by restructure or realignment of a MTF would have access to health care services through the purchased care component of the TRICARE program.

TRICARE - Expanded benefits available under the TRICARE Extended Care Health (ECHO) program, which covers services for a subset of military special needs families with individuals who are diagnosed with intellectual disabilities, a serious physical disability, or an extraordinary physical or psychological condition.

The bill includes no new TRICARE fees or copay increases.

Toxic Exposure - Three new presumptives were added to the list of illnesses linked to Agent Orange exposure - bladder cancer, hypothyroidism, and Parkinsonism.

National Guard and Reserves - Expands hazardous duty incentive pay for the Guard and Reserve component personnel who maintain a proficiency will receive monthly pay like their active-duty counterparts receive when fulfilling required proficiencies like parachute duty, aircrew duty, and many others.

Commissaries and Exchanges – Requires an updated best-case analysis (BCA) before moving forward with efforts to merge the back-office operations of the commissary and exchange systems.

SBP-DIC Offset Elimination Timeline

If you are a survivor receiving or eligible for SBP and are receiving DIC from the VA, expect the first increase in your SBP payment amount, due to the reduced offset, in your February 2021, pay. The three-year transition period will eliminate the SBP offset by 2023. The timeline to eliminate the SBP — DIC offset is:

2020 – The SBP was reduced by the full amount of DIC, \$1340 per month for most annuitants. The \$323 Special Survivor Indemnity Allowance (SSIA) continued.

2021 – The SBP offset amount will ½ less, or \$906 (based on the 2021 DIC amount), plus SSIA.

2022 - The SBP offset amount will be 2/3 less, or \$453, plus SSIA.

2023 - No offset to the SBP amount, and SSIA will go away


