Bipartisan Bill Would Reduce TRICARE Mental Health Copays by Karen Ruedisueli

A bipartisan bill would reduce military family cost sharing for outpatient mental health visits, one of MOAA's top priorities since TRICARE copay increases went into effect Jan. 1, 2018. The bill would cap TRICARE mental health copays at the level paid for primary care visits. TRICARE currently categorizes mental health care as specialty care, which has higher out-of-pocket costs. The bill would reduce these mental health appointment copays for Group A beneficiaries (those whose sponsor entered service before Jan. 1, 2018) significantly:

- **TRICARE Select, active duty family members:** \$22 under the bill, down from \$34 (Note: active duty family members on TRICARE Prime do not pay copays and would not do so under the proposal).
- TRICARE Select, retirees and family members; medical retirees, family members, and survivors: \$30, down from \$46.
- TRICARE Prime, retirees and family members; medical retirees, family members, and survivors: \$21 under the bill, down from \$31.

Budget Update: Where Key Bills Stand as August Recess Nears by Allison Reilly

Lawmakers continue work on the FY 2022 budget as the August recess nears, with House members moving toward a floor vote on a key piece of legislation and senators reaching an agreement on an emergency supplemental to address National Guard budget shortfalls related to the Jan. 6 attack and its aftermath, among other issues. MOAA follows several parts of the budget process closely. The House and Senate Defense Appropriations Subcommittees and Military Construction-Veterans Affairs (MilCon-VA) Appropriations Subcommittees are of interest, with the former having jurisdiction over DoD's budget and the latter overseeing funding for military construction and the VA. As always, Congress is working to pass the budget ahead of the Oct. 1 deadline. If Congress cannot pass a budget before that date, it will need to pass a continuing resolution (CR), which carries over the appropriated funding set in the last fiscal year through a given date, avoiding a government shutdown. CRs have been used in one form or another in every fiscal year since 1997. Failure to pass the budget on time directly impacts the uniformed services, veterans, retirees, survivors, caregivers, and their families. Under a CR, new programs cannot begin, and existing programs stay stagnant at the previous year's funding levels.

There's a New Wave of Scammers Targeting VA Home Loans by Jim Absher (Military.com)

The Department of Veterans Affairs and Consumer Financial Protection Bureau are warning consumers about a new scam targeting veterans with VA guaranteed home loans. The fraudsters try to get veterans to refinance their homes, agree to loan modifications or even start sending their mortgage payments to a new address, according to the release. Some veterans have reported phone calls that appear to come from the local VA office, with the caller telling the veteran their mortgage has been transferred to a new servicer. As a result of this supposed mortgage transfer, the veteran now owes months' worth of mortgage payments, the fraudster claims. To avoid foreclosure, the veteran is told they must make several hundreds or thousands of dollars worth of back payments to the new mortgage holder at a new address, usually through a money order or gift cards. These methods of payment cannot be traced. As usual, the scammers play upon fear and confusion and rapidly disappear once they get what they seek -- your money.

Recruiter's Corner

Member Spotlight: Colonel (Ret) Eldon Woodie

This month it is an honor to introduce a new member to the Greater Birmingham Chapter of MOAA someone who is of great accomplishment in life. Eldon Woodie retired as a Colonel from the USAF in 2007. It was on his 18th birthday in 1974 that Eldon began a distinguished military career by joining the US Army. He went on to serve as a Military Policeman at Fort Rucker, Alabama, and Camp Walker, Korea. Following an honorable discharge from the Army, Eldon then attended Enterprise State Junior College and the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, NC. The Air Force offered Eldon a commission, and pilot training.



Eldon then had a successful and rewarding 27-year Air Force officer's career. He flew 1800 hours as an instructor pilot in Air Training Command. Operationally, he flew 3000 hours in heavy bombers for Strategic Air Command and Air Combat Command. Eldon commanded the 9th Bomb Squadron, Dyess AFB, the 9th Expeditionary Bomb Squadron for combat operations over Afghanistan, the 36th Expeditionary Operations Group, Andersen Air Base, Guam and the 5th Bomb Wing Minot AFB, ND.


After retiring from the Air Force, Eldon served as the Senior AFJROTC Instructor at Thompson High School in Alabaster, AL for four years. He also served in the Veterans Affairs National Cemetery Administration as the Assistant Director at South Florida and Dallas-Fort Worth National Cemeteries. He was the Director for Fort Bliss, Fort Mitchell and Alabama National Cemeteries.

Now, Eldon is active in the local community. His is a key member of the Support Committee for the Alabama National Cemetery and assists with all ceremonies. He helps setting up the Avenue of Flags, setting up chairs, transporting gravesite flags to all sections, parking, and cleaning up. He also performs routine maintenance on support committee equipment. He pulled the SCALNC float for the Birmingham Veterans Day Parade and Montevallo Parade. He is an active member in the Matthew Blount American Legion Post 555, Pelham, AL. Eldon regularly accomplishes monthly buddy checks, helps with various outreach activities, and in fund raising for activities like Wreaths Across America.

Since October of 2020, Eldon serves as the state coordinator for the Missing In America Project. The goal is to locate, identify and inter unclaimed cremains of eligible Veterans. To date, the ALNC burial mission accomplished the interment of five Veterans. He is a key member of the volunteer team that in July, 2021 successfully supported a local Veteran who went on to win election to the State Congress. Eldon conducts many outreaches and education efforts to make Veterans aware of their burial benefits.

Eldon Woodie holds several college degrees. He earned a bachelor's degree in criminal justice, and a Master of Business Administration degree. He also earned a second master's degree in history from the University of Alabama.


