Delay Means Disaster: Servicemembers, Military Families Need Budget Fix Now By Dan Merry

As another continuing resolution (CR) makes its way through Congress, allowing government to limp forward without a full budget well into the fiscal year, damages military readiness and the quality of life of those in uniform and their families. A full-year CR can cost DoD billions of dollars, cripple budget planning, delay or destroy any gains made to benefits through recent authorization legislation and cause immediate headaches for servicemembers and the wider uniformed services community. MOAA remains concerned Congress will remain focused on party priorities and the upcoming midterm elections, resisting their responsibility to come together to fully fund our government. It is imperative we let our legislators know we cannot sit by while their work remains unaccomplished. 'One Step Closer': Burn Pit Bill Would Expand VA Access for Post-9/11 Veterans by Kevin Lilley

Bipartisan legislation put forward by the leaders of the Senate Committee on Veteran's Affairs (SVAC) would expand VA eligibility to about 1 million post-9/11 combat veterans, with the goal of improving access to treatment for conditions stemming from toxic exposure. The Health Care for Burn Pit Veterans Act-supported by MOAA and other major veterans' groups-would open VA health care eligibility for these veterans from five years after discharge to 10 and would also allow for a one-year open enrollment period for any Post-9/11 combat veterans outside the 10-year window. The bill is the first in a three-phase plan to expand benefits. The second phase would involve the creation of a "new, transparent process" for the VA in determining what illnesses can be presumptively connected to toxic exposure, while the third phase would provide "overdue benefits to thousands of toxic exposure veterans who have been long ignored or forgotten." The bill also requires several studies related to toxic exposure, including one on mortality rates of veterans who served in Southwest Asia during the Persian Gulf War. It would increase VA reporting requirements and outreach efforts on toxic exposure and require the VA provide a toxic exposure screening for all veterans during medical visits.

MOAA-Supported Bill Targets VA's Growing Claims Backlog by Kevin Lilley

The Veterans Benefits Improvement Act of 2021, introduced late last year, would address staff recruitment, streamline claims processing and notification practices, and expand outreach efforts to veterans' groups. While the bill does not specifically address the claims, it would:

- Create an internship program for "high-achieving students at law schools" to encourage them to contribute to the Board of Veterans' Appeals and add incentives such as student loan repayment to entice entry-level lawyers.
- Require VA contractors to contact the veteran's representative as well as the veteran when scheduling an exam and improve educational efforts with veterans' groups on the disability exam process; and
- Allow the VA to notify claimants of decisions via e-mail (if the claimant agrees) immediately, rather than using regular mail.


DoD: No Further Extensions Planned for Expired ID Cards!
