<u>Many Veterans/Survivors Now Eligible for Free or Discounted Internet by By Jim Absher originally appeared on Military.com</u>

An updated program from the federal government offers free or discounted internet to many Americans, including many active duty families, veterans and their survivors. The <u>Affordable Connectivity Program</u> (ACP), administered by the FCC, replaces the <u>Emergency Broadband Benefit Program</u>. Those eligible for the ACP include those receiving other federal benefits, such as:

- A VA Veterans Pension
- A VA Survivors Pension (also known as Death Pension)
- SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program), or food stamps
- WIC (Women, infants and children) assistance
- Medicaid
- Free or discounted school lunch or breakfast
- Pell grants
- Supplemental security income (SSI) from Social Security

Those with an income that is at twice the <u>federal poverty guideline</u> or lower are also eligible. That includes a family of four earning no more than \$55,500; a family of two earning no more than \$36,620 or a single person who earns no more than \$27,180. There are higher limits in Alaska and Hawaii. Persons who have a Lifeline phone can also apply for the program. Others may be eligible as well; for more information, see the <u>ACP website</u>. Even if you aren't eligible under these existing stipulations, you may be eligible for the program if you are eligible for discounted internet from your service provider. The ACP program will pay up to \$30 monthly (\$75 for those residing on tribal lands) directly to the internet provider. That means if you have a discounted program like <u>Internet Essentials from Comcast</u>, the nation's largest internet service provider, it may cost you nothing as a participant in the ACP program.

Bill to Support the Families of Deceased, Defrauded Veterans By Kevin Lilley

A bipartisan bill introduced in the Senate on April 5 would ensure families of defrauded veterans receive the benefits owed if the veteran passes away before their case with the VA is resolved. The Restoring Benefits to Defrauded Veterans Act would add language to existing law that would require the VA Secretary to pay out fraud claims to a veteran's estate, a fiduciary who had served the veteran, or the next inheritor. The claims stem from misuse of benefits by a veteran's fiduciary where the secretary is found to have committed "negligent failure" to "investigate and monitor a fiduciary," according to current law. There were about 12,000 allegations of such fraud from January 1, 2018 to September 30, 2019, according to a VA Office of Inspector General (OIG) report. The OIG found no systemic issues with the VA Fiduciary Program, it did find instances of significant wait times, including one veteran owed more than \$20,000 in misused funds who had to wait more than 19 months after the ruling to receive his money.

MOAA-Backed Bill Would Expand Credit Monitoring to More Service Members By Mark Belinsky

A new House bill would expand existing free credit-monitoring services beyond those on active duty, making all in uniform eligible for the benefit. The Servicemembers' Credit Monitoring Enhancement Act expands benefits to include Guard, Reserve, commissioned corps of the U.S. Public Health Service and NOAA, ensuring all uniformed servicemembers have equal access to financial resources as the active component.

MILITARY SPOUSE'S CORNER





Celebrating military spouses was the focus of our May chapter meeting. Mac Chandler expressed appreciation by reading the essay "Military Wife" which was presented in bookmark form to all spouses as they introduced themselves. The Spouse Excellence Award was presented to Anne Hartline for her service to our chapter. This award was well deserved.

Gail Joyce, a MOAA Board Member, Chair of the Surviving Spouse Advisory Council (SSAC) and Co-chair of the Surviving Spouse Virtual Chapter (SSVC 02), was the guest speaker. "Preparing for the Future", which she has presented across the United States, included many important details for planning. Her handout was a check list including the following:

- Gather in one place all important documents: DD214, wills, durable power of attorney, marriage/birth/death certificates, etc.
- Make sure utilities, etc. are in BOTH names
- Spouses need a credit card in their names
- List all passwords in one place and make sure someone else knows where they are located
- Make certain that death certificates state the actual cause of death

Ms. Joyce stressed the importance of having conversations with your spouse, your children or whomever will be the executor of your estate, regarding your finances, other business details and your wishes.

Several publications were provided which can assist with planning for the future.

DoD: No Further Extensions Planned for Expired ID Cards!


