Armed Forces Day is Saturday, May 21. Members of the military understand authority and responsibility. A great story in Luke 7:1-10 tells of the centurion who cared for his servant and the Jewish people. As the ranking soldier in Capernaum, he knew authority. He gave commands, and they were obeyed. This centurion also knew that Jesus spoke with authority. "Say the word, and let my servant be healed." The servant was healed. LEISLATIVE UPDATE

<u>Senators Want TRICARE to Cover Eating Disorders for Retiree Families by Rebecca Kheel originally appeared on Military.com</u>

A bipartisan group of senators wants the military's health insurance to extend coverage for binge eating, anorexia, bulimia and other eating disorders to retirees and their families. The senators also called on defense health officials to ensure the implementation of a provision in last year's defense policy bill expanding <u>Tricare</u>'s coverage of eating disorders for active-duty service members and their families. Previously, Tricare covered only partial hospitalization and intensive outpatient treatment for eating disorders for dependents up to age 20. Under the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), those restrictions for dependents will be gone, and dependents of any age will be able to have inpatient and outpatient care covered. The new coverage is supposed to take effect October 1. The NDAA did not extend eating disorder coverage to military retirees and their families. The senators argue that the defense health officials have the authority to extend the coverage themselves.

Military Compensation: What Is Wrong, and What Works by Dan Merry

MOAA wants to ensure members of all eight uniformed services are adequately compensated for their personal sacrifices through their years of service. What is wrong? MOAA and other advocates must combat the supposition, by reputable researchers, that servicemembers are paid too much, and that these personnel costs prevent officials from equipping troops with modern equipment and needed supplies. Additionally, there are fewer veterans in Congress, and the President (from 2014-2016) used his authority to reduce the military pay raise based on serious economic conditions increasing the pay gap. Overcoming the gap has been difficult over the past few years due to competing priorities in Congress and other fiscal challenges. These factors identify a diminished familiarization with what servicemembers do, how they live, and the challenges they and their families face in service to our nation. MOAA continues to educate those on the Hill who lack the experience of uniformed service, with stories and concerns of those serving today, and to hold all legislators accountable for taking care of the all-volunteer force.

Red Flags Raised by President's Budget Request by Mark Belinsky

The President's FY 2023 budget, submitted to Congress on March 28, seeks \$773 billion for DoD – \$30 billion more than last year. It also includes a 4.6% pay raise for servicemembers and federal workers, but it does not keep up with inflation, prompting cuts to troop strength to fund modernization. The budget request, planned prior to the Russian invasion of Ukraine, included the following active duty personnel authorizations for FY 2023 – all reductions from the previous year:

- Army: 473,000, down from 485,000.
- Navy: 346,300, down from 346,920.
- Air Force: 323,400, down from 329,220.
- Marine Corps: 177,000, down from 178,500.

A senior defense official cited recruiting challenges and a reduced propensity to serve as contributing factors to reinvest personnel savings in other areas. The reductions are even more of an issue given the increased threats in Eastern Europe and the straits of Taiwan. The moves directly conflict with DoD's own budget briefing materials, which described the department's people as "key to U.S. deterrence across domains, theaters and the spectrum of conflict."

Both her son, who was killed in Somalia, and her husband are buried at Arlington National Cemetery.

DoD: No Further Extensions Planned for Expired ID Cards!


