Hello dear friends,

I recently was introduced to the magazine, "TAPS", which stands for Tragedy Assistance Program For Survivors.

At first glance I thought it was a magazine for young widows and remarriage, children of a fallen soldier, and servicemen killed in action.

TAPS had stories about falling in love again, Good Grief camps for bereaved children and teenagers, and how to deal with a tragic death.

However, as I read more deeply, I saw articles on grieving at any time, on grieving but not being crazy, and on hope and healing.

I want to share some comforting words from an article entitled, "Wearing Your Heart on Your Sleeve", written by Matt Daud, a surviving father of CPL Christopher Daud, US Marine Corps Reserve. He talks about proudly remembering the loss of his son by wearing distinctive colors, caps or shirts. Belonging to a unique group of people who have endured similar experiences encourages one to feel like he/she belongs to a family. Complete strangers would approach him and ask about his service connection. This led to conversations about his son. Talking about his son eased the pain into pride and joy. This tight connection to other people brings healing. Instead of mourning by yourself, you talk about your loss with pride. He ends his article with the knowledge that survivors know "we belong to a family unlike any other."

'The Vodka for Dog People': Tito's Donates \$65K to Help Expand Hand in Paw's Animal-Assisted Therapy

August 7, 2023

Animal-assisted therapy provider Hand in Paw recently received a donation from Tito's Handmade Vodka that will help expand its ability to provide animal therapy to help vulnerable populations.

The \$65,000 gift from Tito's will enable Hand in Paw to train, evaluate, mentor and place therapy teams, as well as provide animal-assisted therapy, to senior citizens and veterans in central Alabama.

Hand in Paw serves several vulnerable populations. The dogs and handlers are trained to provide comfort and affection to people in hospitals, retirement homes, hospice care and schools.

But the group has been experiencing a shortage of therapy teams to meet the needs of the community.

"With the support of Tito's Handmade Vodka, Hand in Paw will now be able to provide services to organizations, like the Veteran Affairs Hospital in Birmingham and seniors in facilities throughout central Alabama at no cost," a press release issued by the organization states.

Funding from Tito's, which dubs itself "the Vodka for Dog People," will allow Hand in Paw to recruit and train 30 new therapy teams in one year that will visit senior citizens and veterans who may be experiencing anxiety and isolation, among other emotional issues.

Additionally, the donation will allow Hand in Paw to launch a targeted volunteer recruitment campaign to help expand the nonprofit's growing "paw print" in the greater Birmingham and Tuscaloosa areas.

"We are truly honored to have this support from Tito's Handmade Vodka to expand our animal-assisted therapy program," said Margaret Stinnett, executive director at Hand in Paw. "This funding will create the opportunity for dynamic growth within our organization and allow us to continue serving our central Alabama communities."


Lindsey Bates, director of philanthropy operations at Tito's, said, "We're excited to support the work that Hand in Paw is doing to serve vulnerable populations in need. As the Vodka for Dog People, we know firsthand the positive impact that dogs can have, and the care that Hand in Paw is providing in Birmingham will continue to benefit the community for years to come."

Hand in Paw is accepting applications for its Therapy Team.

Prospective service animals must be two years or older, and the owner must have owned the animal for more than six months.

Additionally, dogs and their owners are required to complete a group obedience course, according to the press release, to ensure the animal and owner are well-prepared to begin the intensive Therapy Team training program.

PURCHASING INDIVIDUAL TICKETS

1. From the event website above, select "Purchase Tickets" button on the right side of the page.

2. Select "Individual Ticket" and enter the name, email address and phone number of the ticket holder. If you have been invited to be at the head table, you may select "Head Table".

3. Select the applicable group from the list (scroll down to see the entire list). Click add ticket which is on the left side after the last group name.

4. You can click "Add Another Ticket" to purchase additional tickets and repeat steps 2 and 3.

5. When finished adding tickets, click next, fill in your contact information, and pay.

- 6. Each ticket holder will be emailed their individual ticket.
- 7. About a week prior to the event, all ticket holders will receive an email with their table assignments.

PURCHASING A TABLE

- 1. From the event website above, select "Purchase a Table".
- 2. Check the box if you will be sitting at this table.
- 3. Select the applicable group from the list (scroll down to see the entire list).
- 4. Click next, fill in your contact information and pay.

5. You can enter the names and email addresses of the other table attendees now or wait on the email with a link to do it later.

After purchasing a table, you will receive an email with a link to invite your guests. Click on the link and you will be taken to the page where you will enter their names and email addresses. When submitted, they will receive an invitation and they can choose confirm or deny.

Confirmed guests will be routed back to the event website to confirm email and receive ticket. As the table host, you will receive a notification of any declining.
