Twelve Hands and a Flag: The Raising of the Stars and Stripes Over Iwo Jima.

Photographer Joe Rosenthal snapped a photo of six men raising a flag on the summit of Mount Suribachi on February 23, 1945, on the island of Iwo Jima in one of the bloodiest fights in the Pacific during World War II. The iconic image has become the very symbol of the United States Marine Corps. This presentation chronicles how the six men had been misidentified an astonishing **three** times before the Commandant of the Marine Corps finally set the record straight in 2020 on the identity of those six men.

MILITARY SPOUSE'S CORNER



"No mail, low morale"

Who doesn't like to get a card in the mail? When it's our birthday or special holiday, like Christmas, we are happy to be remembered. What about getting a card for no special occasion? That indeed can lift our spirits! I want to share with you an article I read in the <u>DAV</u> magazine, January/February 2024 edition, entitled, "No Mail, Low Morale". The article talks about an all-female US Army unit during WWII called the 6888 Central Postal Directory Battalion, known as the "Six Triple Eight". They were shipped to Birmingham, England with one clear mission: "Sort and deliver years of backlogged mail intended for US troops, government personnel, and Red Cross workers serving in the European theater." The mail was two to three years old, meaning our soldiers had not heard from their loved ones at home in a very long time. Imagine how poor their morale must have been!

The dedication of this female unit had helped to connect our US troops to the home front. Battalion Six Triple Eight received recognition in 2018 when a monument in their honor was unveiled at Buffalo Soldier Military Park in Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. In 2022 legislation awarded the unit the Congressional Gold Medal.

This inspiring article made me think of our MOAA GBC Ladies Committee.

I want to thank our committee, a group of eight, who reach out to our 44 surviving spouses monthly. It isn't always a card in the mail; it might be a phone call, a text, or an email message. Whatever means of communication is used, the purpose is the same. We want to boost the morale of our surviving spouses and remind them they are not forgotten.
