Eligibility: Honorably serving, former, or retired Warrants, Chief Warrants, or commissioned officers of the armed forces (Regular, Reserve, National Guard) as well as current, former, or retired USCG, NOAA, USPHS commissioned officers and surviving spouses from all branches are eligible to join MOAA. CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Years ago, when the Military Services wanted to recruit young men and women to be soldiers, they didn't have fancy TV commercials. All they had was a POSTER. On it was a drawing of a man with a tall hat, a goatee, and a finger pointed outward with these words underneath: *"Uncle Sam Wants You!"* That meant that the United States government wanted you to be a soldier. How did *Uncle Sam* become a symbol for the United States? There was once a man in Massachusetts named Samuel Wilson who was around when Paul Revere made his famous ride to warn the American people that the British were coming. Later Sam Wilson worked for the government stamping the letters "U.S." on barrels of beef. Since those initials had not previously been used to Stand for "United States," the townspeople assumed they meant "Uncle Sam." And before long, Uncle Sam had acquired a goatee and a tall hat, and people around the world thought of him as a symbol for the United States of America. On June 14, 1775, the U.S. Army was founded when the Continental Congress authorized enlistment of *"expert riflemen"* to serve the United Colonies for one year.

May God continue to bless our nation and those who serve in all the military services.

We reminisced about times our husband was deployed leaving us to raise the children alone, spending a holiday without him, or waving goodbye as he leaves for a place unknown. A while back, we had selected a spouse to receive the Spouse Excellence Award; she is Margie J. Argo. In case you missed the May meeting, I want to share with you Margie's biography:" Margie was born and raised in South Louisiana. She obtained a BS degree in Food and Nutrition from the University of Southwestern Louisiana in Lafayette in 1968 and a MS degree from LSU in Baton Rouge in 1970. In 1982, Margie was commissioned as a 1 LT in the AL Army National Guard assigned to the 109th Evac Hospital in Birmingham as a Hospital Dietitian/Weight Control Officer. During this assignment, she received her appointment to CPT. In 1998 she was transferred to the 167th SPT CMD to serve as Subsistence and Weight Control Officer. While in this assignment, she was promoted to MAJ. In 2001 Margie was transferred to the USAR 75th Combat Support Hospital in Tuscaloosa with a promotion to LTC. In this position she served as a Hospital Dietitian and supervised food service personnel in various base and field hospitals. Margie retired in March 2005 with a combined total of 23 years of service. In civilian life Margie worked in various areas of Nutrition and Food service. Her longest held position was with Jefferson County Health Department in Birmingham. She worked as a Public Health Nutritionist from 1982 to 2003. Margie remains active as a member of MOAA, MOAA Ladies and JCDH Retirees. As often as they can, Margie and her husband Jerry take off to visit the "Grands" in Montana and Maryland."
